#### The APC Pandemic team continues to monitor community conditions related to the pandemic in order for us to gather as safely and as openly as possible for worship.

### We have adjusted some of our safety protocols recently.

#### For outdoor worship:

- We are now allowing masks to be optional after you have found your seat for worship.
- We urge those not yet vaccinated to continue to wear masks at this time.

#### For indoor worship:

- While worshipers are in their pews, masks are now optional, except all are to be masked while singing, since singing is a significant way to spread airborne germs. The congregation is now invited to sing whenever there are music offerings and not just at the end of it. In summary, be masked as you enter, while you are singing, and as you exit the sanctuary. We urge those not yet vaccinated to wear masks throughout their time in the building.
- We continue to practice social distancing and we urge people to refrain from shaking • hands or offering hugs.

We continue our worship registration for both services so we would have the information necessary for contact tracing if necessary. And, as always, please do not attend in person if you are not feeling well that day.

Located in Germantown, **Face-to-Face** has evolved into a multi-service organization that offers free services to more than 2,500 low income and homeless individuals each year. Its mission is to provide for the health, well-being and stability of the surrounding community. Face-to-Face houses a nurse managed Health Center, Social Services Center, Legal Center, Neighborhood Arts Studio and Summer Camp program. Guests can take hot showers onsite in the Washeteria and receive a new set of clothes. Chef Altenor prepares hot meals five days a week, served in the Dining Room, family style. There are many volunteer opportunities. You can help prepare and serve meals in the Dining Room or work in their vegetable garden. If you are not able to volunteer onsite, you can make casseroles or sandwiches at home and drop them off. You can also donate shampoo, soap and other items for toiletry bags or purchase sweatpants, tee shirts, and underwear for distribution at the Washerteria.
