The APC Pandemic team continues to monitor community conditions related to the pandemic in order for us to gather as safely and as openly as possible for worship.

We have adjusted some of our safety protocols recently.

- Our current safety protocols call for all to be masked when you are in the sanctuary except when receiving communion or when you are speaking as a worship leader.
- We continue to practice social distancing. Yellow tape marks spaces for individuals to sit. Blue tape shows where two can sit together. Red tape is for larger groups of people from the same pod.

You no longer have to register for worship attendance, with the exception being the Christmas by Candlelight programs on December 12 and the Christmas Eve services. If contract tracing is necessary, an email will be sent to all on the congregational email blast list. You can opt in to be contacted using the 'We Want You to Know' card you find in the pew rack. As always, please do not attend in person if you are not feeling well that day. If you end up with a positive COVID test after attending worship, please contact KLHill@apcusa.org as soon as possible.

Gemma Services changes lives by transforming hope into action for children, youth and families facing emotional and behavioral challenges often caused by loss or serious traumas such as abuse, neglect and addiction. Presbyterian Giving Catalogue

Gifts purchased from the Presbyterian Giving Catalogue are tangible ways that you can provide help and relief to people, families and communities around the world.

Fishing Net, \$15. Small-scale fishermen rely on their catch for income and food. When damaged, nets are too expensive to replace, some use mosquito nets which can introduce insecticides into waterways. Help protect livelihoods and the environment with a gift of a fishing net.

Family of Chickens, \$25. Eggs for food, feathers for pillows and fertilizer for crops. By giving a family of chickens, you can help improve the food security and livelihoods of farmers and families around the world.

Kitchen Kit, \$25. Food requires preparation and families who have lost everything in a disaster often lack the basic tools needed to cook a meal. A kitchen kit contains cooking pots, utensils, bowls, cups and spoons.
