The late Michael Kemp served as APC's Director of Music from 1991 to 1998 and grew the community participation in the orchestra and Oratorio choir as part of the strong community connections that continue to mark music ministry and the concert series to this day. We honor his memory and the unique musical connections he created and strengthened in this community with our dedication of the Christmas by Candlelight concerts to his memory.
