As I have mentioned before the COVID crisis has presented our church with some unique challenges, but it has also presented us with some unique opportunities for ministry and service in the name of Christ. While it has not been easy, I am quite impressed with the ways in which the Faith family has remained steadfast during this crisis which has enabled our church to care for and share the gospel of Christ with one another and our community in a variety of ways.

Now that we are entering the initial stage of what I call, the "post-COVID" era," we need to realize that as much as we would like, it will be impossible for our church to return to the way things were in March of 2020. While that may not be a reality we want to confront, it is one we must confront. It is also a reality that provides our congregation with the opportunity to carve out some new ways of ministry that may help us touch more people with the good news of Jesus. Thus, the task before us in the coming months will be to discover how we can create a vibrant and vital church in this "post-COVID" world. During the coming weeks, my Sunday sermons will highlight some of the characteristics of such a vibrant and vital church. To guide us on this journey, we will be using the creative work of Methodist Bishop and author, the Rev. Robert Schnase who suggests that there are five essential practices that today's churches need to embrace if they are to bear the fruit of the gospel. Those five practices are: Radical Hospitality, Passionate Worship, Intentional Faith Development, Risk-taking Mission, and Extravagant **Generosity.** Our Sunday conversations on these practices will be bracketed by a review of the fundamental characteristics of the Post-Pentecost Church as described in the Book of Acts and how we might tap into of the power of God's Holy Spirit at work among us, which, as the Apostle Paul notes in his Letter to the Ephesians, "is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine."



My prayer is that together, we will press on to the call Christ has placed before us and do whatever it takes to create a vibrant and vital witness to Jesus Christ in the months and years to come.



#### **CONGREGATIONAL MEETING**

The Session has called a Meeting of the Congregation for 10:00 am Sunday, June  $6^{th}$  to be held in the Sanctuary as well as via Zoom video conference for the purposes listed below. The link for the Zoom video conference will be emailed to the congregation on Friday, June  $4^{th}$ .

- 1. To amend the Leadership Organization Structure to increase the length of term for Commissioned Deacons from two to three years beginning with the Class of 2024. This amendment is needed to provide for the appropriate rotation of three classes of two Deacons each.
- 2.
