AN UPDATE FROM OUR TREASURERS

From a budgetary perspective, this has been an interesting year. Normally, every November the Executive Committee develops and presents a budget to Session for the following year. In this process, we look at our income and expenses for the current and prior years, and then attempt to predict what the next year's income and expenses will be. At times it is an art as much as a science.

During years when not much changes, our "predictions" - the budget – can be fairly accurate. But this year in particular has not been a typical year. Several things have changed during the year, which have had a major impact on our budget.

Our interim minister Reverend Mary retired at the end of January. During the search for a Stated Supply pastor, we were (fortunately) able to hire Reverend Mary again for a 3-month period, from March through May. Then, of course, our Pastoral Nominating Committee completed their work and found our new permanent minister, Pastor Patrick. And that involved creating a new financial contract – none of which we knew in the prior November budget meeting.

In addition, we renovated both our church (the Narthex, upstairs bathrooms, etc.) as well as the Manse, which also had a major impact on the budget. And although we attempted to estimate most of this in our prior year budget meeting, I am sure the estimates will turn out to be different from the actual expenses – we will see at year's end.

Having said all that, Geneva is doing well. Executive and Session continue to carefully monitor our expenses and income each month, and I do not foresee any major financial issues that will derail our work and mission to our community.

Please continue to faithfully support our church with your time, talents and treasure, and please be patient with me at our next congregational meeting, if our budget and the actual numbers did not exactly match up for the year.

Geneva Day School has had a very busy summer, and an especially amazing summer camp! 200 youngsters enrolled with 40 volunteer counselors and 90 paid staff working at various times over the 11 week period! Weekly themes guided the many activity choices each day, with at least one special interactive program presented during the week. Ms. Daisy Lizama is commended for her amazing organization of another summer of appropriate yet exciting experiences. She and Ms. Debra Lieberman both celebrated their 20th anniversary of working summer camp this year!

The Geneva office staff have been busy over the summer responding to many requests for information about the school and providing personal tours of the

facility. It continued the application and registration process, tracked the return of required forms and payment, worked with families to design the best program for children and their families, and concluded many tasks involved at the end of a school year. It was also getting ready for the new year, the 55th of the school! It updated staff and parent handbooks, planned and conducted August training and meetings, disseminated summer mailings to all families, prepared information for the Parent-Child visitations, and supported staff in a wide range of administrative tasks as requested. Many thanks to Mrs. Amanda White and Mrs. Amantha Linkie for their usual great work!

Geneva was ready for its new and returning students for the first days of school which officially began on September 3. Some parents had as many tears as they young children at first, especially those who had never been apart, but now both young and older seem comfortable. We celebrated with the traditional Welcome Back Social on September 6. Pizza, popsicles, and play on the playground were enjoyed by all! The gathering made a large celebratory circle by holding hands to create a human conductor circuit to demonstrate how important everyone is at Geneva – And we made the light shine!

Several Geneva staff resigned last year and were replaced by new faces this fall. Mrs. Carol Rushing is working in Kindergarten, Mrs. Carrie Mazur is working in Mrs. Landres' Class, and Mrs. Joyce Oranje is working in Ms. Lizama's Class. Geneva was not able to "replace" Mrs. Heidi Gharib, our special Extended Care Coordinator and Teaching Assistant of 39 years, but it was able to collect several staff to provide this important coverage for students in the early morning and after school. Mr. Lucas Johnson will be the After Care Coordinator each afternoon.

Classes have all been thoroughly cleaned, painted, with carpets and all toys washed, and furniture has been repositioned. Bulletin boards are covered and awaiting pictures from new students. Please feel free to walk around and notice the amazing rooms where so much learning and fun are already taking place! You can really imagine how staff are "encouraging a lifelong love of learning" in every classroom!

CLERK OF SESSION

Fans of old movies may occasionally reference a cinema classic from Hollywood's Golden Age to illustrate some point or other. There may be some honest debate about what constitutes an "old movie". For some of us, it would seem odd to refer to Shawshank Redemption as an "old movie", however it was released in 1994, thus making it 25 years old this year.

So please indulge me as I reference Shawshank Redemption and draw a strained and stretched-out analogy between Tim Robbins' character Andy Dufresne and the GPC's Clerk of Session (me). A climatic moment being Andy, after years of incarceration, escaping through a 500 foot pipe of raw sewage to gain release/redemption in the purifying rain of freedom—that is just like your Clerk's situation early in the summer (minus the raw sewage, admittedly).

After years of ignoring the call to have the Session records reviewed by the National Capital Presbytery, on May 29th the minutes/records of the past several years were reviewed with comments/recommendations made by Sara Coe. The records received "Approval with exceptions noted" --the exceptions being more clerical and administrative than substantive. Like Andy of Shawshank, it felt liberating and cleansing after so many years to be free of the yoke of oppression . . . perhaps I am overstating matters a little bit!

One small issue that came up during the review of Geneva's Session records was that of Congregational Minutes . . . they are entered into the record, however there is not a clear mechanism for sharing them with the congregation. With the publication of this issue of the Radiant, it seems appropriate to share them with you all now.

Congregational Meeting of Geneva Presbyterian Church--Meeting Minutes—July 07, 2019

A Congregational Meeting of Geneva Presbyterian Church was called to order on July 07, 2019 by the Reverend Ed Taylor serving as Moderator. As the meeting opened, the congregation was led in prayer by the Moderator.

Verification of a Quorum: Rev. Taylor asked the Clerk of Session to verify the presence of a quorum in keeping with GPC Bylaw 3.9. Mark Allen (C. of S.) confirmed that a quorum of more than 20 members in good standing was in place.

Appointment of a Secretary to the Congregational Meeting: In keeping with GPC Bylaw 3.4, Rev. Taylor announced that Mark Allen as Clerk of Session was to serve as Secretary of the Congregational Meeting.

Confirmation of Appropriate Notice for Scheduling the Congregational Meeting: Rev. Taylor requested and received verbal confirmation from the Clerk of Session, M. Allen, that the guidelines (GPC Bylaw 3.2) had been followed in scheduling and announcing this Congregational Meeting.

Stated Purpose of the Congregational Meeting: Rev. Taylor outlined that the purpose of the Congregational meeting was for the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC), who had requested the meeting, to present its report to the Congregation. There will be an opportunity for the PNC to receive questions from the Congregation. It is expected that at the conclusion of the PNC Report and response to any questions, the name of a candidate for Installed Pastor will be put forward, a ballot distributed to all active members in attendance at this meeting and a vote taken regarding the candidate.

Report from the PNC: Each member of the PNC (Jane Campbell, Renee Moloznik, Bob Ricci, Sheri Sankey and Elaine Winch) shared with the congregation brief narratives describing their experiences, insights and conclusions regarding the search for new pastor for GPC. The PNC also expressed great appreciation to the leadership and collaboration of Terry Murray who served as the Liaison from the National Capital Presbytery to GPC's PNC. The PNC offered their strong and unanimous endorsement of the Rev. Patrick E. McElwaine and officially nominated him for the position of Installed Pastor of GPC.

Rev. Taylor solicited any questions to the PNC from the congregation regarding any aspect of the process of arriving at the selection of Rev. McElwaine as the nominated candidate.

While several general comments expressing appreciation for the effort and outcome of the PNC were voiced, no questions were posed.

Explanation of the Voting Process: Rev. Taylor explained that all active members of the GPC rolls in attendance would be able to vote. The ballot contains three options (Yes, No, and Abstain) and each member receives one vote. The vote is for both for the nominee (Rev. Patrick McElwaine) to be offered the position of Installed Pastor and for the "Terms of Call".

When all members have received and marked their ballots, the three designated counters (Mark Allen, Katie Harris and John Wright) will collect the anonymous ballots and tally the votes in accordance with directions provided to them previously by Rev. Taylor.

Results of the Vote: The counters having tabulated the ballots and re-checked them a second time for accuracy, provided the outcome to Rev. Taylor who announced the results to the congregation. There were 42 ballots collected and counted. All 42 were marked as "Yes" with no abstentions or "No" votes. A member of the PNC, Sheri Sankey, provided the voting results to Rev. McElwaine who had been sequestered in the church office during the congregational meeting held in the sanctuary.

Presentation of Rev. McElwaine: The vote having been conducted and the results announced, Rev. McElwaine and his wife, Allyson were heartily welcomed into the GPC sanctuary to join the congregation for the conclusion of the Congregational Meeting.

Dissolution of the PNC: Their arduous task having been successfully completed, a motion was made, seconded and carried to dissolve the PNC. The members were dismissed with the GPC congregation's profound appreciation for their outstanding service.

Adjournment of the Congregation Meeting: The business of the Congregation Meeting having been concluded a motion to adjourn was made, seconded and carried. The Congregational Meeting was ended with a prayer led by Rev. McElwaine.


