

ABOUT OUR MUSIC...

You'll notice that our Opening Hymn is shaped by its traditional Jewish tune. This selection of English stanzas conveys the essence of the Yigdal, a canticle based on a medieval Hebrew statement of faith about the nature of God and often used in synagogue worship, alternately chanted by cantor and congregation. The tune dates back to the 17th century and was adapted by Meyer Lyon and Thomas Olivers in 1770.

Our Sending Hymn tune is a personal favorite of mine. I can't help but feel overwhelming joy and celebration when I hear it. The text was the winner in a hymn competition sponsored by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Bicentennial Committee for the 1988-1989 observance, which had the theme "Celebrate the Journey." The late 18th-century tune (first used with Psalm 148) is appropriately celebratory.

• COVID-19 Update

Soon after Geneva Presbyterian Church closed our physical building due to COVID-19 in March, I recall having conversations with ministry colleagues about Easter: would we be back physically in the sanctuary by then? As time continued and we got used to the "new normal" of worshiping and gathering digitally, our milestones kept shifting, too. Would we "be back" by Pentecost? The start of the new school year? By Advent?

Deciding when and how to meet is a challenging decision that churches are making with input from government agencies and healthcare professionals. The Session of Geneva Presbyterian Church has carefully monitored developments these past months and continues to feel strongly that keeping the church building closed for in-person uses is the correct decision to promote safety for our community. Our church staff is collaborating and working well remotely and we will continue in this way.

For now, we will maintain our commitment to sharing the Gospel, serving Jesus, and worshipping together using the digital tools that have served us well. Our "ministry toolbox" has grown in four key ways using Zoom and I encourage you to plug in to each:

- 1. Virtual Church worship each Sunday @ 10:30am (recordings on church website)
- 2. Virtual Bible Study each Wednesday @ 7:00pm
- 3. Periodic Deacon "family group" gatherings

4. The Geneva Book Club on select Fridays @ 7:00pm (calendar in bulletin or Weekly Email)


In terms of next steps, a special team has been working diligently to update our sanctuary with live video streaming and recording capabilities. They are making great strides and we're on the doorstep of physically installing the equipment. We look forward to having a small worship leadership team (myself, Ben, singer/s, and the A/V team) broadcast Sunday service from the sanctuary soon. This will be an "intermediate step" on our road to reopening when the time is right, though live streaming and recording will also be a welcome addition to the life of our church moving forward.

Like each of you, I long for the day our church family can safely gather in person again. Until then, we will continue to love God, love our neighbors, and love each other in ways that prioritize the health and welfare of all. Thank you for continuing to pray and care for our church family with the love of Christ himself.


