

Get Prepared For Virtual Communion This Sunday In Worship!

This Sunday we will be sharing the sacrament of The Lord's Supper digitally during Virtual Church. Here's how it will work and here is how you can prepare:

- Gather your own communion elements from around your home ahead of worship Sunday morning. Jesus chose common foods of his day for the first communion: bread and "fruit of the vine". What common starch do you have available? In countries around the world, the commonly available starch is tortillas and rice, so those are used. What beverage feels right for you to use? Not everyone has juice in the home, so we might need to be creative.
- Please: in preparing for communion and choosing your elements, do so thoughtfully and with reverence for the sacrament we will share.
- -Since we are gathered for worship as a community in the way that is possible for us right now, our liturgy in the sanctuary will serve as a blessing for all of our elements.

It's a joy to share to share the Lord's Supper together - let us gather at Jesus' table!

In both Hebrew and Greek, the words for "spirit" can equally well be translated as "breath" or "wind," so it is very appropriate to address the Holy Spirit as the "Breath of God." This tune by an English organist has become the customary one in North American hymnals.

Our closing hymn's tune is an Irish folk melody that has proved popular and easily sung despite its lack of repetition and wide range. The stanzas are selected from a 20th-century English poetic version of an Irish monastic prayer dating to the 10th century or before.

- 5. Please review the video to make sure it sounds good before you send it
- 6. Make sure you include your thank you to the moms in your special way, whether you've made a sign, you have your mom's picture, or your mom in person to share the message. We encourage your creativity!
- 7. Please send to Geneva to: **GenevaMoms@Gmail.com** by **Friday May 7th at 5pm** so that the submissions can be edited and broadcast as apart of our worship service on Mother's Day Sunday, May 9th.
- 8. If you have trouble, please reach out. We can always record someone over Zoom!
- 9. Make sure the entire face is in the shot, try not to cut off foreheads, or be too close to the camera.
- 10. Be aware of backgrounds [the view and the noises] and try not to film yourself squinting into the sun or on a noisy street.

• Our Second Neurodiverse Play Date

Geneva held our second play date for autistic and neurodiverse children and their caregivers on our playground on Saturday, 5/1 and it went great! Children and families had a wonderful time and appreciated Geneva organizing such a fun and engaging experience. So it's easy to remember, the Disability Ministry Team will continue hosting these play dates the first Saturday of each month from 10:00–12:00 (weather permitting). Spread the word if you know families of autistic or neurodiverse children who would appreciate participating!

• Geneva Presbyterian Reopening Team

The Session of Geneva Presbyterian Church has established a "Reopening Team" to prepare for the coming time when we will reopen the church building for in person worship, and eventually other uses. This team will draft and recommend for Session's consideration new protocols and safety procedures that will enable those who choose to gather in person to do so appropriately. This team will review opening plans from other churches while considering what works for our church family.

Regardless of what our reopening plan will look like, we will continue our virtual/online offerings of worship, Bible Study, and fellowship — that's here to stay! We do not have a firm date set for resuming in person worship, but we are working toward it and will be in communication as Geneva's plans take shape.

• Disability Ministry Team Giving Opportunity

Geneva Presbyterian is coming alongside our non-speaking autistic neighbors in Montgomery County to purchase Augmentative and Adaptive Communication (AAC) devices for students at the Ivymount School on Seven Locks Rd. We are dedicating our non-pledged offerings received on Easter to help purchase these devices.


